§ 300.39 Special education.

(a) *General.*

(1) *Special education* means specially designed instruction, at no cost to the parents, to meet the unique needs of a child with a disability, including -

- (i) Instruction conducted in the classroom, in the home, in hospitals and institutions, and in other settings; and
- (ii) Instruction in physical education.

(2) *Special education* includes each of the following, if the services otherwise meet the requirements of paragraph (a)(1) of this section -

- (i) Speech-language pathology services, or any other related service, if the service is considered special education rather than a related service under State standards;

- (ii) **Travel training**; and
- (iii) Vocational education.
